WHYY's Learning Lab will be a unique physical – and virtual – place that will share the power of digital technology to foster a more connected and informed community.

The four areas of the Lab provide space, resources, and equipment to encourage creativity and learning using a wide variety of digital communication tools:

Lincoln Financial Digital Education Studio

A flexible presentation space equipped to easily record and distribute performances, demonstrations, lectures, professional development training and meetings. Audiences in the Studio can be linked with others participating at remote locations. Any event happening in this space can be distributed live through WHYY's media outlets or archived and edited for later use.

Community Room

This “smart” classroom designed for hands-on learning will welcome representatives from every corner of the community and help them to extend their work through digital technology. Users will include corporate trainers, teachers seeking professional development, local arts organization staff and high school students expressing themselves through their own video productions.

Digital Kitchen

This workspace with editing stations and a meeting area is a place for innovation and experimentation. Electronic editing, special effects, computer arts, sound mixing and content storage will be available to students and staff to try out new projects.

The Portal

In the Learning Lab's lobby and digital showcase center, visitors can search the digital archives of previous projects, and enjoy changing exhibits on large-screen displays.
